Interoception

What is interoception?

Interoception is our internal sensory system in which the internal physical and emotional states of the body are noticed, recognised/identified and responded to. Interoception skills are required for a range of basic and more advanced functions such as knowing when to go to the toilet, being aware that you are becoming angry or upset and being able to manage your emotions proactively. When children and young people have not yet developed interoception skills they will struggle with not only their own emotions but with social interactions and even just being around others may be difficult for them to manage.

Interoception activities help children connect to and learn to understand their own bodies and emotions.



Benefits of interoception

Children experience many benefits from engaging in interoception activities. Interoception is a pre-requisite skill for self-management and self regulation. It provides children with the tools to know when they are developing emotional reactions and the skills to be in control of those reactions.

When will it occur at school?

Children will participate in interoception twice a day within their classroom, an activity takes only a few minutes. If children have 'Garage Time' they will get to participate in additional interoception activities.

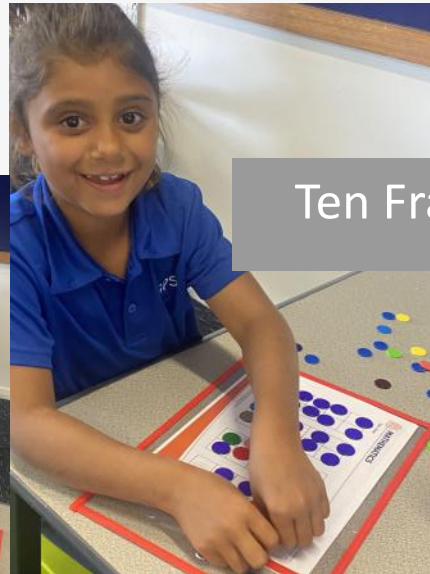
