Social & emotional books

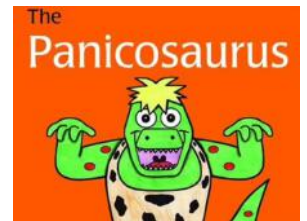
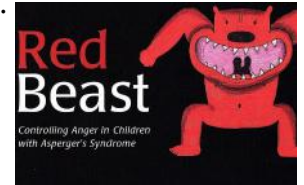
Social and emotional learning is important. When children have an understanding of their emotions it gives them the ability to recognise, handle and appropriately express them. Some children are instinctively in tune with their emotions, and will be ready to deal with new/ different situations/people more easily. Others may need a bit more help. All children need to have their social and emotional skills nurtured, supported and encouraged.

This term children have been working through a series of books to support their social and emotional skills. These books have included;

The Panicosaurus - Recognising and managing anxiety and worry.

The Red Beast - Recognising and managing anger.

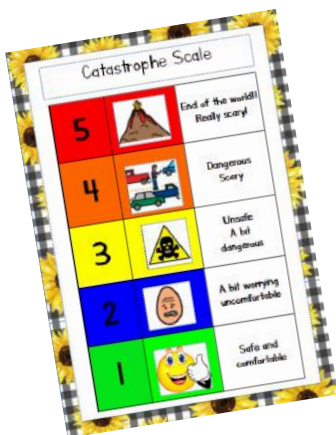
The Disappointment Dragon - Recognising and managing disappointment

The Catastrophe Scale

The catastrophe scale supports children to understand their problems in perspective and helps them determine how big the problem is. This term there has been a lot of discussions about problems and how the children can manage their responses and what strategies they can use when faced with problems. It has been helping children to regulate their emotions and respond more calmly when faced with different and difficult situations.

What's The Buzz

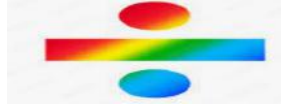
