PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

Last week 4 students from the 5/6 class, myself and Karin Garrett attended this years STEM Congress. The STEM congress gives Aboriginal students the opportunity to hear from keynote speakers and prominent Aboriginal STEM experts and attend workshops designed and delivered by YASTA students.



Our students attended a workshop at the University of Adelaide called 'Innovate and Engineer: See a Challenge, Create a Solution'. The first challenge was to copy the process of creating optical glass fibre using a hot glue gun. This challenge was to see who could make the longest optical fibre.



The next challenge was working in 2 teams, Team 1 was in charge of programming a rover to enter the moon crater. Team 2 was the constructor, their job was to construct a way for the rover to get in and out of the crater.



Students all had a lot of fun doing both of these challenges. The entire 2 days of STEM allow students to think about their world and how everything that they use has STEM involved. On Tuesday morning Emma Pedler from the ABC radio interviewed the students about their experience at STEM. They all spoke very well, representing the school well.
