Here are a few happy snaps of our day.

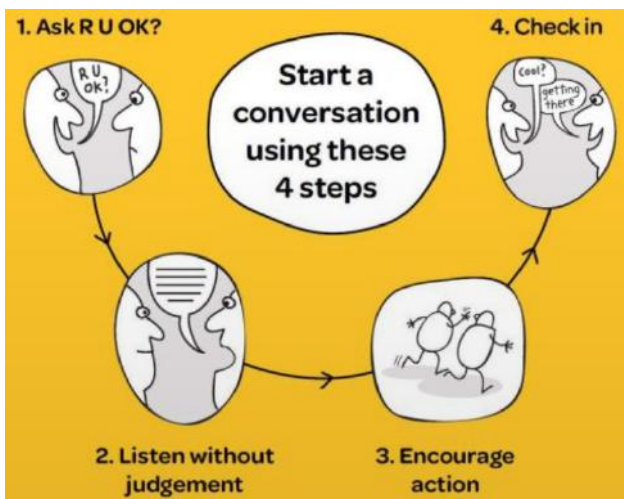


## How to start an "are you okay" conversation
